Suds . . . Skillettes . . . Stitchers

It is not often that we want to wash laundry so when we have a request from a gentleman I hasten to do my best. E. H. Hayes was in the store the other day and said that his wife and several other women in their community were members of the Mangie Sandwich Spread regulars. I am very happy that they liked this recipe. I think it is a fine one and am anxious to repeat it.

Mrs. George McFerrin of Berlinburg who sent it to me:

Mango Sandwich Spread

1/2 cup butter

12 red peppers

12 green tomatoes

2 onions

3 cups sugar

1 cup flour

1 quart jar salted dressing

1/2 cup vinegar

1 T. salt

1 T. pepper

Grind all vegetables and tomatoes and onions. Pour boiling water over them and let stand 5 minutes. Drain Mix all together and cook 10 minutes. Stir well. Cool. Boil sugar and flour over low heat until a superior bread and butter pickle is ice them thoroughly in a pickle jar. That makes the pickle very good. It is not necessary to add salt to the pickle. It is usually unless the flabby store-boughten variety which are so discouraging when you eat them.

Bread and Butter Pickles

To make cucumbers crisp, slice them thinly. Slice about 4 cups of cucumbers and let them sit for 10 minutes in green pepper and a cup of vinegar. In the dish pan or something big, lay the slices with salt and sugar no more than 1/2 cup of each salt for 10 minutes. Add 3 garlic cloves and cover. Then add ice cubes working them through the cucumbers so that cool all the way. Turn the cucumbers over to the top and let stand for three chilling hours adding ice if needed.

When they are good and cold drain off all water. Prepare a mixture of 3 cups distilled white vinegar, 5 cups sugar, 1 T. yellowed mustard, and 2 T. mustard. Pour this over the cucumber slices and bring to a boil. Don't cook it. When it is cool add the pickles and cover. Let it stand a day or two.

Then add a few drops of oil to the pickles, lay them away to the pickling process can work a month.

When they are good and cold drain off all water.

Prepare a mixture of 3 cups distilled white vinegar, 5 cups sugar, 1 T. yellowed mustard, and 2 T. mustard. Pour this over the cucumbers and bring to a boil. Don't cook it. When it is cool add the pickles and cover.

Prepare a mixture of 3 cups distilled white vinegar, 5 cups sugar, 1 T. yellowed mustard, and 2 T. mustard. Pour this over the cucumbers and bring to a boil. Don't cook it. When it is cool add the pickles and cover.

Then add a few drops of oil to the pickles, lay them away to the pickling process can work a month.

When they are good and cold drain off all water.
